

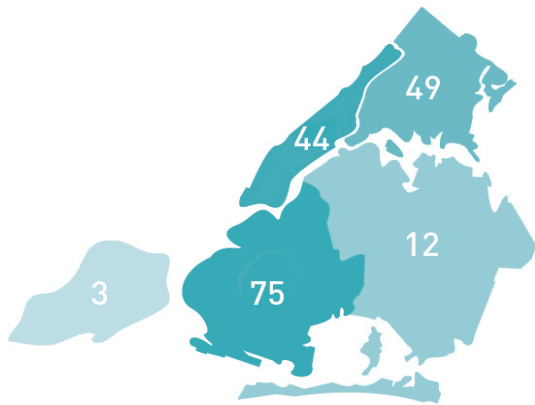

### Collective bargaining agreements:

**23** NYC charter schools (10%) have contracts or are negotiating contracts with the United Federation of Teachers union.

### Facilities:

- 108** charter schools are in buildings owned by the NYC DOE.
- 68** charter schools are in non-DOE space.
- 7** charter schools have some students in NYC DOE space and some in private space.

### Charter school programs:

- 6** schools have dual language programs.
- 5** schools serve high school students at risk of dropping out.
